UNITED WAY CELEBRATES 97th YEAR and UNITE Forever Campaign

FRISCO, TX (May 5, 2022) – The United Way of Metropolitan Dallas (UWMD) celebrated 97 years at The Star in Frisco, where they announced they have pushed past the finish line for its \$100 million endowment, called the Unite Forever Campaign. This milestone comes three years ahead of schedule, setting up the foundation for the future in perpetuity. It was a celebration of the impact that United Way has in North Texas and of the countless ways they have built a movement to create lasting change in our community.

In 2014, UWMD launched the Unite Forever endowment campaign, with a goal of raising \$100 million in 10 years to establish permanent funding that would enable United Way to address the unexpected and serve our community for generations to come. The Caroline Rose Hunt Family and The Rosewood Foundation have been significant donors. In 2015, the grandchildren of Caroline Rose Hunt committed a lead gift of \$5 million to honor their grandmother and her longstanding support and dedication to United Way and its Foundation.
